Preparing for Change & Pupil Wellbeing



School Bags

P4 - P7 parents PLEASE DO NOT BUY a SCHOOL

BAG. One of the observations learned when implementing Covid mitigations was the usage of and need for school bags.

What we found was:

- 1. Children do not need to bring cumbersome school bags in and out each day.
- 2. Traditional School Bags take up lots of space which we simply do not have.
- 3. The satchels we already use for P1-P3 will also be suffice for P4-P7 needs.
- 4. Up until now the cost has always been below £5 and we envisage it to be in and around that this year. This is a significant saving on traditional school bags.

In light of these findings, this upcoming year we are going to trial a different approach from P4 – P7. We are going to extend the use of the satchels we already use in P1 – P3 throughout the school with different colourings for each Key Stage. The school will purchase these satchels on parents' behalf for all pupils and in late August parents will pay for them via School Money app.

We will review this trial procedure at school year end and seek feedback at that stage from both parents and pupils.
